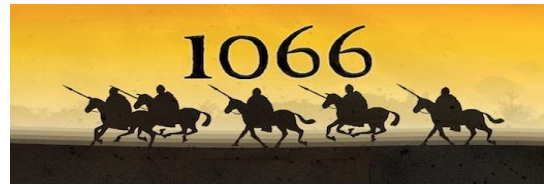


History

Term 1.1 (Sept – October Half Term)

Norman Conquest



- **Places to visit:** Medieval Castles – Clifford’s Tower in York, Skipton Castle, Middleham Castle, Bolton Castle, Richmond Castle, Helmsley Castle. Write a piece of historical fiction based on your visit – you can use stories you have heard there as an inspiration
- **Documentaries to watch:** The Normans, Robert Bartlett, Crime & Punishment – Feud Glorious Feud, Time Team: 1066, The Lost Battlefield (Youtube) List 5 new pieces of information you have learnt from watching.
- **Books to read:** Horrible Histories – Storming Normans, Smashing Saxons, Vicious Vikings, The Viking Saga by Henry Treece, Conquest by Stewart Binns, The Last Kingdom by Bernard Cornwell. Write a review of the book you have read.

Term 1.2 (Oct Half Term – Christmas)

Medieval Church to Magna Carta

- **Places to visit:** Ripon Cathedral, Fountains Abbey, Kirkstall Abbey, Adel Parish Church, Lincoln Cathedral, Lincoln Castle (Magna Carta). Draw the church/ abbey you have visited. What are the characteristics of Norman architecture?
- **Documentaries/ Films to watch:** Terry Jones’ Medieval Lives, Pilgrimage with Simon Reeve , The Third Crusade: Saladin & Richard the Lionheart (Youtube) Kingdom of Heaven (Crusades), Secrets Great British Castles (Netflix).
- **Books to read:** The Time travellers Guide to Medieval England by Ian Mortimer, God’s Wolf: The Life of the Most Notorious of All Crusades, Reynald de Chatillon. Write a review

Term 2.1 (Christmas - February HT)

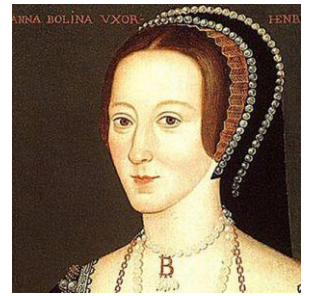
Black Death – Peasants Revolt – War of the Roses

- **Places to visit:** Middleham Castle, Royal Armouries, Wharram Percy. Create a brochure for tourists coming to visit the attraction – what can a visitor expect to see? How would you attract them?
- **Documentaries/ Films to watch:** The Hollow Crown (adaptation of Shakespeare’s Henry VI and Richard III) available from Amazon, The King in the Carpark (4OD), King Richard III (BBC Monarchy Documentary) The Peasants’ Revolt – Tony Robinson, British History’s Biggest Fibs (Youtube), She Wolves: England’s Early Queens (Netflix). Create a trailer for the documentary you watched or for a documentary you would like to make. You can do it as a storyboard or you could even make a film!
- **Books to read:** Horrible Histories – Measly Middle Ages, The White Queen, Philippa Gregory, Richard III, Shakespeare. Why not try writing some historical fiction of your own?

Term 2.2 and 3.1 (February HT- May HT)

Tudors

- **Places to visit:** Temple Newsam House, Hardwick Hall (Derbyshire), Rivaulx Abbey, Jervaulx Abbey, Whitby Abbey, The Royal Armouries
- **Documentaries/ Films to watch:** Wolf Hall, (Netflix), Six Wives of Henry VIII, David Starkey – Henry VIII/ Elizabeth etc (Youtube), The Other Boleyn Girl,
- **Books to read:** Horrible Histories – Terrible Tudors, Shardlake series (Dissolution etc) by CJ Sansom.



Term 3.2 (May HT - July)

Local study: York

- **Places to visit** – York! Walk the walls, visit Jorvik to explore Viking York, Clifford’s Tower – a great example of a motte and bailey castle, York Minster – one of Europe’s most magnificent medieval cathedrals, the Railway Museum, Castle Museum, York Chocolate Story – a fun trip which provides lots of information on the industrial and religious heritage of York.
- **Books to Read:** Gruesome Guide to York by Terry Deary, Secret York by Paul Chrystal
