

Wellbeing Award at School (WAS)

Pupils Wellbeing Update

In Spring 2018, years 7 and 9, participated in a National Wellbeing online survey which was implemented by Manchester University and Anna Freud organisation. The survey was to capture data in relation to students' emotional and mental health wellbeing.

We have now received the results from the survey.

Our school achieved green or amber scores in all categories which covered topics such as "emotional strengths and skills", "Support Networks" and "Mental Health and Wellbeing". A green rating indicates that on average, scores for our students were better than average for those of the same age across secondary schools nationally. An amber rating shows that on average, scores for our students are not discernibly different to average scores for those of the same age across secondary schools nationally.

Below is a snapshot of the results we received:

- Only 3.8% of our students recorded having any difficulties with peers whereas nationally 6.9% was recorded across other schools
- Year 9 female students recorded a score well above the national standard for feeling supported by adults outside home and school other than students
- Interestingly, our Year 9 boys (2017/2018) were slightly below the national average in feeling that they have adequate problem solving skills.

The school will embrace the findings of this survey, together with the recommendations from Optimus Education Awardplace and will adopt any improvements suggested to enhance and improve the overall wellbeing and mental health of the whole school community.

We are currently waiting for our official Wellbeing Action Plan from our independent adviser, but have been busy organising teams of staff to plan, implement and review the required work for each of the eight key objectives.

News from the Science Desk – November 2018

This week in Science

Astronomers of the European Southern Observatory have discovered the second exoplanet closest to the Earth: it is only six light years away from us, and it is a poorly lit and very cold “super Earth”. At a speed of 50,000km/h (the speed that the Voyager probe is travelling at), it would take 129,000 Years to get there (best take a pack up).

Year 7

All pupils have now been introduced to safety and may be approaching the assessment at the end of the first topic. Further topics that pupils will be encountering this year are: B7.1 Cells and Reproduction, C7.1 Safety and Particles, P7.1 Forces and Motion, B7.2 Classification and Variation, C7.2 Acids and Rocks, P7.2 Heating and Energy. The aim is that pupils will have completed their first two topics by the end of this term, will have had feedback and set their own targets to improve, and we can then send a summary report to give you an indication as to how they have started their studies.

Year 8

We hope that pupils have now settled in to their new Science sets and may be approaching the assessment at the end of the first topic. Further topics that pupils will encounter this year are: B8.1 Digestions and Respiration, C8.1 Elements, Compounds and Mixtures, P8.1 Light and Sound, B8.2 Causes of Disease, C8.2 Reactivity of Metals, P8.2 Magnetism and Electricity. The aim is that pupils will have completed their first two topics by the end of this term, will have had feedback and set their own targets to improve. After Christmas we will be sending home a long report, including comments, to give you an indication as to how they have progressed in the beginning of Y8.

The two books above can be obtained for a combined price of £7.50 from the Science prep room, and will allow pupils to consolidate their understanding in addition to the support material and worksheets for the whole key stage in the KS3 area of the VLE.

Year 9

Pupils have now had their Kerboodle account activated, which provides on-line text books supporting the new specification together with a suite of further resources which are very useful when accessed. Pupils should have completed their first topics in Biology, Chemistry and Physics by Christmas, at which time we will be able to see who is thriving on the GCSE material, and those that are finding the step more of a challenge.

Year 10

I hope that you had the opportunity of meeting the Science teachers at the recent parent’s evening, and have been given a good idea as to how your son/daughter are settling down to their studies as they continue with their GCSEs. Currently there are 3 groups of separates, of around 25 students per class, which will allow additional setting after the first mock examinations in Science, after the Christmas break, where there is evidence to suggest that this is advisable. We will provide pupils with a list of topics to revise in advance of the Christmas break.

Year 11

Next week Y11 will receive their mock examination results. We have used questions from a range of papers from this year’s GCSEs, and therefore have based the grade boundaries around these. This will give a fair reflection of the grade they could expect, with the same degree of preparation, in Summer.

We are aware that pupils may not have approached these ‘mock’ examination, with the appropriate self-motivation and determination, and so will use the results of these to inform our forecasts.

It is clear that some pupils are struggling with the content and pace of the Separates, and as there is an increased entry from the private sector from IGCSE, the competition is even more fierce than in previous years. Pupils



struggling to achieve a grade 6 or above are likely to find themselves falling towards a grade 4 in separates, and may be best served through achieving two higher grades in Combined.

Pupils struggling to achieve a level 4 in Combined Higher, would be recommended by the examination board to be entered for the Foundation Tier.

We will begin to have these conversations after the mock results have been published.

We have started the lunchtime sessions on Fridays, there are a large number of staff who are willing to give up their time to support pupils. Each subject Biology, Chemistry and Physics is available at the appropriate level. All pupils are welcome, and we will prioritise those who have most need, which will be further identified from the results of the mock examinations. We will be offering after school sessions, led by members of our sixth form, after half term, which showed a marked improvement for those who took advantage of this last year

Pupils will continue to have access to Kerboodle which will provide on-line text books supporting the new specification together with a suite of further resources which are very useful if accessed.

We have identified suitable revision guides and work books for the new curriculum. We will carry a rolling stock of books that are suitable for Revision Guide and Workbook together for Combined Science (£10), and Revision Guide and Workbook for each of Biology, Chemistry and Physics (£4 each). If you are unsure as to which is the most suitable then the class teacher will be able to advice accordingly.
